
Turks & Caicos (Just Started – Still Under Construction)



Grand Turk is one of the islands that form the Turks and Caicos archipelago, located 575 miles southeast of Miami, Florida, and 30 miles south of the Bahamas. The Island is seven miles long and 1.5 miles wide. The average temperature ranges between 85-90 degrees (29-32 degrees Celsius) from June to Oct., sometimes reaching the mid 90's (35 degrees Celsius), especially in the late summer months. From Nov. to May the average temperature is 80-84 degrees (27-29 degrees Celsius). A constant trade wind keeps the climate at a very comfortable level. In an average year, Grand Turk has 350 days of sunshine. Approximately 3,700 inhabitants make Grand Turk their home. The island's primary language is English. There are certain phrases that vary from the English language and certain terms that give a Turks & Caicos flavor to the spoken word. The U.S. dollar is the official currency of the Island. Most hotels, restaurants and shops accept traveler's checks that can be cashed at local banks. Most credit cards are accepted and banks offer ATM's as well as cash advances on

credit cards. Grand Turk is on EST. Daylight Savings Time is observed from April to October.

The Turks and Caicos Islands consist of 40 islands and cays, eight of which are inhabited. The islands are located 550 miles southeast of Miami, Florida, just below the Bahamas chain and just to the east of Cuba and the island of Hispaniola (Dominican Republic and Haiti.) Technically, the Turks and Caicos are located in the Atlantic Ocean, not the Caribbean Sea. The islands are home to roughly 30,000 full time residents, and welcome more than 200,000 tourist annually.

Language - English

Currency - The US dollar is the official currency of Turks and Caicos. Most hotels, restaurants and taxi services accept traveler's cheques, which can be cashed at local banks. Most credit cards are accepted and banks offer ATM's as well as cash advances on credit cards. Tipping is normally paid to waiters, taxi drivers, maids and porters at 15%.

Time Zone - Eastern Standard Time and Daylight Savings Time is observed from April to October.

Electricity - 110 volt/60 cycle, suitable for U.S. appliances.

Climate - The average temperature ranges between 85 and 90 degrees (29-32 degrees celsius) from June to October, sometimes reaching the mid 90's (35 degrees celsius), especially in the late summer months. From November to May the average temperature is 80 to 84 degrees (27-29 degrees celsius). Water temperature in the summer is 82 to 84 degrees (28-29 degrees celsius) and in winter about 74 to 78 degrees (23-26 degrees celsius). A constant trade wind keeps the climate at a very comfortable level. There is an annual rainfall of 21 inches on Grand Turk and South Caicos, but as you go further west the average rainfall could increase to 40 inches. In an average year the Turks and Caicos has 350 days of sunshine. Hurricane season runs from June 1 to November 30th.


People - Turks & Caicos Islanders are mostly descendants of Africans who were brought in to work the salt pans or the cotton plantations. The expatriate population consists of British, Canadians, Americans, French, Bahamians, people from Hispaniola and virtually everywhere in the world.

Economy - The economy of the TCI relies on the tourism industry, real estate development and the exportation of seafood. A wide variety of financial services are available, including company formation, offshore insurance, banking, trusts, limited partnerships and limited life companies. The Financial Services Commission regulates, develops and promotes the industry in major world markets.

Government - The Turks & Caicos Islands are a British Crown Colony. A Governor is appointed by the Queen and presides over an Executive Council formed by an elected local self-government. Government offices are located in Grand Turk, with branches on other Islands as needed. The legal system is based on English Common Law.

If you have cell service in the USA please bring your phone with you because if you have International Roaming service with a cellular carrier that has a roaming agreement in the Caribbean then your phone will be able to make and receive calls

	whilst in the Turks and Caicos. If you do not have roaming then you will be able to make calls using the credit card platform.
	Postal Service - Post Offices are located on all inhabited islands. All mail is transported by air. There are many different issues and denominations of stamps for enthusiasts to collect. Philatelic Bureaus are located on both Provo and Grand Turk.
	Driving License Requirements - Visitors from the British Commonwealth Countries, The United States of America, Canada and holders of International drivers license are permitted to drive for 30 days on their respective license.
	Visitors from all other countries are required to posses a Visitors Permit, which can be obtained at the Road Safety Department, located on Good Street, Grand Turk and at the office on the Old Airport Road, Providenciales.
	Crime - These Islands boast one of the lowest crime rates and highest crime-solved rates in the Caribbean. We cannot, however, let down the guard against opportunist-type theft. Do not leave valuables unattended. Lock doors and windows. Use the hotel safe for storage of valuables. These simple precautions should prevent the loss of cash, jewelry and identification. Confrontation and violent crimes are extremely rare. Any problems should be reported immediately to the Royal Turks and Caicos Police.
	Clothing - Shorts are worn in town as well as the beach during the day, it is advisable to also wear sunhats and sunscreen. In the evenings, light sweaters and jackets may be occasionally needed in the winter. Dinner is usually not formal, most restaraunts accept dress shorts while others require pants with a collared shirt for gentlemen and dress slacks or dresses for the ladies.
	Public Nudity is illegal throughout the islands.

When your power snorkel adventure is finished, the transportation will return you to the cruise center. (Duration: 2 1/2 hours. Minimum age for participation is 12 years)

Sunbathe, swim, snorkel or relax on a complimentary beach chair as you listen to traditional island music. Snorkeling equipment is included. Additional food and beverages are available for purchase.



Your sailing catamaran adventure begins at the cruise center when you meet your crew and board the beautiful catamaran. Set sail for a fantastic deserted beach and stop for snorkeling along the way. During a quick tour of the horse shelter, learn how the local wild horses and donkeys evolved over time from being the main means of transportation during the height of the salt industry, to becoming wandering, homeless animals until

the horse shelter was built for. Once safely mounted on your horse and after an orientation period enjoy a leisurely guided ride on the bluff overlooking the beach. Return to the beach where your guide will unsaddle the horse and prepare it for the swim. Next, remount your horse and enter the ocean for one of the most exciting experiences ever – a swim in the ocean with your horse! Afterwards, you can take a shower and relax before being transferred back to the ship. (Duration: 2.15 hours. Minimum age for passengers is 6 years. Maximum weight is 250 lbs.)

Grand Turk Lighthouse--The lighthouse was brought in pieces from the UK where it had been constructed in 1852. The lighthouse and lighthouse keeper's house is a prized historic site and is protected by the National Trust. The Lighthouse provides some shade, a picnic area and an excellent viewing spot for the whales in February and March.
